

Table Grid Editor

Xporter for Jira allows you to extract data from the Table Grid Editor (iDalko) custom field.

Definition

Let's say this Table Grid Editor (iDalko) custom field is named "Table Grid Editor." The definition will be:

```
#{Table Grid Editor}
```

That's it. No other special configuration is needed.

 We highly recommend always using the [html](#) function with this custom field in order to get formatted data.

Examples

```
If you want to extract raw data from a Table Grid Editor (iDalko) custom field named "Table Grid Editor", use:
#{Table Grid Editor}
You can also apply the HTML function to this (we highly recommend that you do this):
#{html:Table Grid Editor}
```
